# About dyslexia

- ☐ Known as a reading disorder
- ☐ People with dyslexia have trouble with reading despite normal intelligence.
- ☐ Problems may include difficulties in spelling words, reading quickly, writing words, pronouncing words when reading along and understanding what one reads
- ☐ Problems are different from one to another
- ☐ The cause of it can be genetic or environmental factors


#### What is it?
